

NASA Glenn Research Center (GRC) Adopt-A-Highway Program



Each year, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) collects more than 200,000 bags of trash from our highways. The job is time-consuming and costly.

Since 1995, GRC volunteers have "adopted" the John H. Glenn Highway I-480/Grayton Road interchange. This interchange is an important highway area in the GRC neighborhood and serves as the gateway to Cleveland for many visitors who arrive at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport. Safety vests, gloves, trash bags, and other essentials are provided for the job. Transportation is provided in GRC vans and trucks. GRC efforts are acknowledged by two signs on I-480.

ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY GLENN RESEARCH CENTER

Cleanups occur during the warm months and there is a charge number for the activity. Cleanups require approximately 2.5 hours per event. Watch Today@Glenn for announcements of monthly cleanups.
